I t's amazing how intricate our world is. The earth is like a gigantic puzzle, and we are only just beginning to comprehend how all the pieces fit together. "Economics interested me because it is so relevant to everything that occurs," Melyssa said. "Economics touches everyone's life in both big and small ways. It helps you apply theory to reallife situations and hone your analytical abilities."

Melyssa has already used her analytical abilities to have a positive impact in a real-life situation. During the summer of 2011, she was employed as a business analyst intern for Torchmark Corporation, a health and life insurance company with multiple subsidiaries. In her position, Melyssa was responsible for assisting with a project to improve Torchmark's process for compensating insurance agents. She analyzed the state of business operations, discovered inefficiencies, created proposals based on cost analyses, and presented her work to the other project team members and the company's executive management team.

Melyssa said that many of the classes and programs offered in the Spears School helped her attain and excel in her internship.

"Presenting to the CEO of a major company can be intimidating, but due my speech class and other classes that had a presentation requirement, I was able to communicate effectively," Melyssa said. "Also, programs such as résumé polishing classes, mock interviews and career fairs led me to be more comfortable and at ease in interviews and other professional situations."

To prospective students, Melyssa recommended not only joining student groups but also truly immersing themselves in their roles within these organizations.

"Students realize that leadership roles in various organizations look good on their résumés," Melyssa said. "But once you obtain that role, don't be complacent and content with just going through the motions. Take an active role in contributing value because making decisions, converting ideas into reality based on your available resources, and working effectively on a team are all things that will continue to be not simply valuable in any career, but required."

Because of her hard work, Melyssa has been accepted to DePaul University to pursue a master's degree in economic policy analysis. Once she completes her degree, Melyssa said she hopes to find a job where she can really make a difference in our world.
