Kyle got the opportunity for these professional development roles after a life-changing study abroad trip to South Australia. During his 7-month trip, Kyle took classes at the University of South Australia, met people from diverse backgrounds and traveled with them around the globe. He also went backpacking down the Australian coast, camping in the Outback, diving in the Great Barrier Reef, swimming in shark-infested waters, surfing on Arctic and Pacific waves, driving on sand dunes, jumping off cliffs, and parasailing over New Zealand.

"Words cannot even begin to describe my awesome experience," Kyle said. "I was lucky enough to be able to travel before, during and after my semester in South Australia, but this trip truly changed my life. I am so thankful for the opportunity I had to study in such a great country."

In his role as the Oklahoma Ambassador for the Embassy of Australia, Kyle got to share his experiences with the OSU campus, promote study abroad and gain valuable work experience with the Australian Embassy. As the North American Ambassador for the University of South Australia, he has traveled around the country encouraging American students to study at his exchange university. These opportunities also helped Kyle land a summer internship with ConocoPhillips' global marketing department, where he revised ConocoPhillips' credit card fraud policy and developed an implementation and communication plan for a new credit card.

Kyle said his secrets to success are his work ethic and his love for trying new things. In addition to his experiences in Australia and his internship, Kyle has studied abroad in China, organized Stillwater's Japanese Relief Effort for victims of the country's recent tsunami, and served in countless leadership roles across OSU's campus. He is currently OSU's student body vice president as well as the president for Business Student Council.

"Opportunity – that's what makes Oklahoma State an incredible university," Kyle said. "OSU is truly dedicated to fulfilling the goals and dreams of students through leadership, involvement, education, service and so much more.

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Why international business?

To earn an international business degree, you will complete 120 hours of undergraduate coursework.
