- Support local industry & attract new industry




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A Snapshot of Oklahoma's Resource Mix

Habitat Conservation: The Lesser Prairie-Chicken



- The state of Oklahoma has spent more than \$26 million on conservation efforts
- Range wide plan has been developed as both a listingavoidance plan and postlisting mitigation plan
- Listing determination expected by March 2014

Collaboration is the Key


