■ Oklahoma Aerospace Industry

- One of the State's 5 wealth-generating ecosystems
- 144,000 jobs statewide (9% of Oklahoma employment)
- Annual payroll of \$5.3 billion
- Annual industrial output of \$12.5 billion

■ Tinker Air Force Base

- Largest military aircraft repair facility in the world
- Oklahoma's largest single-site employer ~ 28,000 jobs
- Annual economic impact of \$3 billion

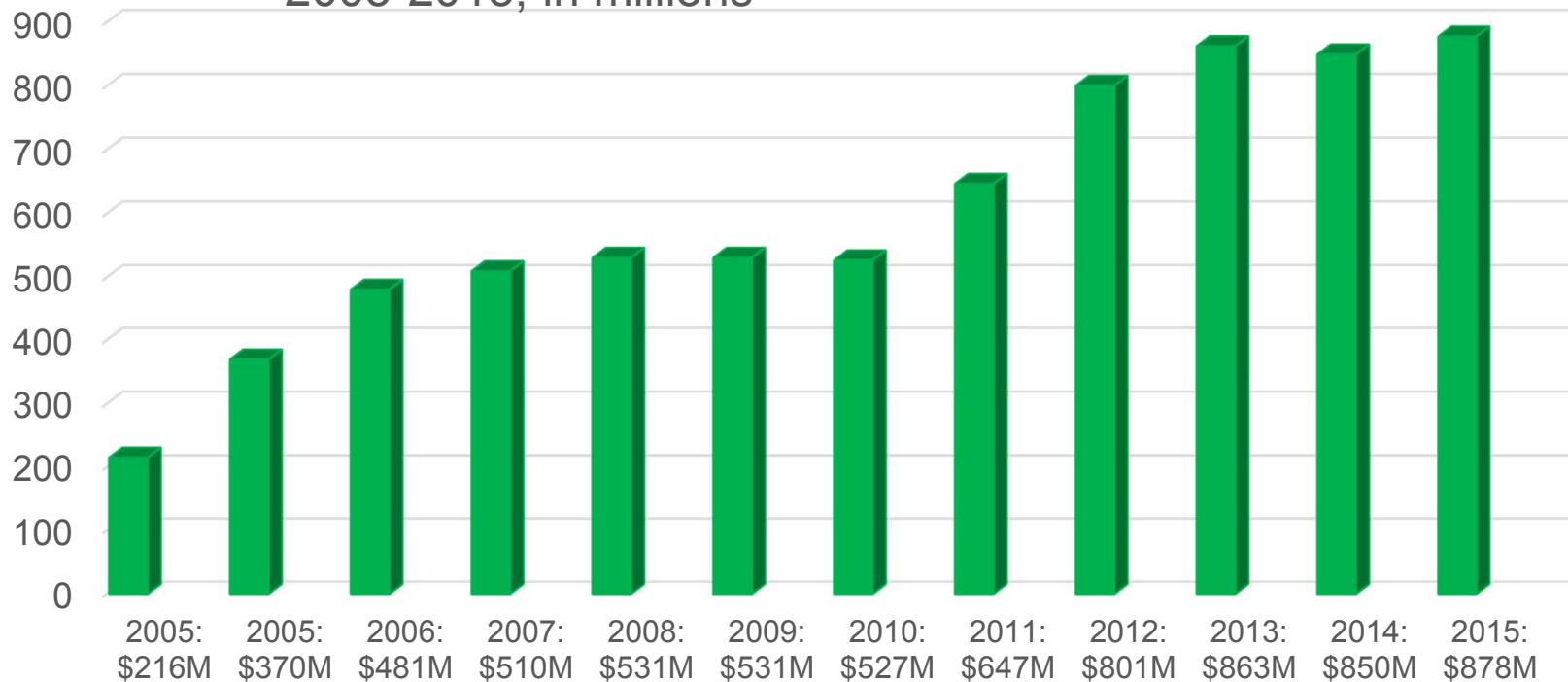
