
What you need to download. Go to EEE 2023 Intro to Entrepreneurship SEC TH 004

The Journal is a one page, 400 word defense of your original idea on reading the course material.


- Read the materials in the Textbook. (Opportunity Recognition, then Resources, then Manage Risk, and then Follow Through)
