• In this course, we introduce the topic of international public law, examine the legal aspects of international business transactions, contrast different legal systems, and conclude with a study of employment law.

Instructor guidelines and policies

Reading:

- Text: Understanding of the course material requires that students keep up with the reading assignments. Students should read the assigned material before class.
- Cases: Judicial opinions provide a key element in understanding the law. For that reason, it is important to read and understand the assigned cases.
- Additional reading: Additional reading assignments may be posted online. Students are required to read all additional material.

Examinations:

- The class is divided into three sections, each covering a segment of the textbook and outside readings. At the end of each section, an exam will be given. The exam will cover the lectures, class discussions, videos, assigned readings, and textbook.
- Exams may consist of essay, multiple choice, and short answer questions. Students must bring a pencil, pen, and any other required testing materials to each exam.
- Each exam will cover only the immediately preceding segment of the class. Each of the exams will be worth 100 points.

Writing assignments:

- There will be two timed writing assignments. A topic and instructions will be posted on D2L. You will have 48 hours from the time of posting of the assignment until it is due to be turned in. You will access the writing assignments on D2L in the Dropbox section. The writing assignments are not proctored.
- Each writing assignment is worth 50 points.
- The writing assignments are not research papers. Instead, think of them as thought pieces. You will be given the opportunity to analyze a current international law issue and, using the information you learned in class, prepare a short essay of approximately 500 to 1000 words.
- You will be graded on content, structure, form, and grammar. Please take the time to proofread your paper before turning it in.
- Students will **NOT** be allowed to make up the writing assignment. If you fail to turn in the writing assignment on time, you will receive a grade of 29/50 (the highest possible failing grade).

Make-up Exams:

- Make-up exams are discretionary. Before being allowed to take a make-up exam, you must provide a reasonable excuse for failing to take the exam. After missing an exam, you must notify me by email that you will need to take a make-up exam.
- Make-up exams will be given immediately after the final exam. You will take the make-up exam immediately after the final exam, during the scheduled final exam period.
- Make-up exams will differ from the questions assigned to the class.
- If more than one exam is missed, the make-up exam will count for each of the missed exams.
