Overview of the Course

This course introduces the student to the basic principles underlying the field of management. It focuses on the basic roles, skills and functions of management, highlighting managerial responsibility for effective and efficient achievement of goals. Special attention is given to social responsibility, managerial ethics, and the importance of multi-national organizations. This is a twelve-week course – as such it "moves" at a quicker pace than a regular 16-week course. Please review the class schedule and keep up with the assignments and exams. The material covered will be relevant to you, regardless of your career objectives. In all likelihood, you will either be a manager or work with a manager in any occupation you choose. Ultimately, we are all managers of our own lives and can benefit by studying to be better managers.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Exams (100 points each)

There are three exams which are all required. While the tests are worth 20% each, we weight your top exam higher and your low exam will not count as much. In effect, we award the top test a 30% weight and the bottom test a 10% weight. This can only help you! The examinations will consist of multiple choice questions. They will cover material up to the date of the exam, unless otherwise stated. They will be based upon the text and supplemental readings, lectures, and class activities. **Note**: if you want to do well on the exams, watch the video lectures AND read the book! There is material covered in the lectures that is not in the text and this material will be on the exam.

We have many options to take the exam. *If you are in the Stillwater area*, we expect that you will take the on-campus exam on the specified date, time, and place. If you have conflicts with the scheduled exam, you may opt to take the exam at the Wes Watkins Center with an assigned proctor (this will incur \$12-\$15 fee). You do not need my permission if it is one day before or after the scheduled date. *For those of you who are not in the Stillwater area*, you will still be given the exam online with an approved proctor – contact the Distance Learning Office to arrange for a proctor. The Distance Learning Office must approve your proctor before you will be allowed to take the exam, so please contact them as soon as possible to make the appropriate arrangements.

Make-up Policy

Students are expected to take each exam on the date given and submit each assignment by the deadline. In the EXTREMELY unlikely event that you miss a scheduled exam, you will be allowed to take the make-up exam ONLY IF, you have a valid excuse. Valid excuses include 1) out of town on a university sponsored event, 2) under doctor's care, 3) attending a funeral or 4) a work conflict.

In all cases, we MUST be informed of your absence at least eight hours before the exam. If we approve your absence, you <u>must</u> make arrangements with the Wes Watkins Testing Center (309 Wes Watkins) to schedule your make-up exam. Again, there is a fee associated with taking exams there so plan accordingly.

Quizzes and Video Cases (12 x 10 points each)

In Connect, there are roughly 20 possible quizzes or video cases. We will accept **ONLY** your top 12 assignments – you can do all 20 or just 12, but we will take the best of your best. The quizzes are TIMED (8 minutes for 10 questions), online so you will not have time to consult your book/notes during a quiz. These quizzes are designed to help you better prepare for the exam and to give you an idea of the type of questions you can expect to find on each exam. Don't cheat yourself... they are a great practice to the exams. Once the time limit is reached, your answers will be recorded and you will not be able to continue, so be prepared. For video cases, remember that you must watch the entire video to get the full credit from the questions. Again, be prepared before you start watching! All of the scoring for quizzes, tests, and video cases is done automatically and instantaneously.

<u>Learn Smart Modules (16 chapters – 80 points)</u>

In Connect, there is a learning device called Learn Smart. We have included a 30 minute module for each chapter which will help students learn course material and study for exams. All chapters have an associated LearnSmart... you must do thenm all! Connect will assign a "completion" grade for each chapter.

Extra Credit Opportunity

There will be an opportunity to earn extra credit in this course. First, I will have roughly ten short quizzes on a variety of easy videos (usually worth one point each). They will have a tight window of opportunity but are incredibly easy! Also, we typically have a PhD student who is doing research post an extra credit assignment. When these are announced, I will tell you the PhD student's name and contact number. It will run independently from our GA.
