Briefly describe your role and responsibilities as an intern.

ConAgra Foods is a Fortune 200 company along with being one of the largest food companies in the U.S. Popular items made include: Orville Redenbacher, PAM, Chef Boyardee, Marie Callender's, and many more. My internship is at the corporate headquarters in Omaha, Neb. In a nutshell, I am a "co-pilot" to the numerous sales teams. Many of my reports help direct sales reps to reach certain sales targets or gain efficiency in a certain area. Specifically, I send daily/weekly/monthly reports that involve sales team performance and recording daily sales for the company. I also do miscellaneous projects to improve company systems and make reporting more efficient. This is necessary because in a corporation with many functions, each sector uses certain tools or systems and collaboration is a constant battle. ConAgra Foods is great about truly investing in interns' future success. Executives spend time conducting "Lessons from Leaders" to give great career advice and help put a "face to the name." I have scheduled numerous lunches with upper-management employees which reflects the overall genuine, transparent company culture. Surprising to my expectations, my internship experience has been both a great learning experience and really fun.

What has your internship taught you about this career field?
